



Moosehaven



Established in 1922 and located in Orange Park, Florida, Moosehaven is a premier retirement community, exclusively serving the men and women of the fraternity.

The campus is situated on 72 acres, along the beautiful St. Johns River in Northeast Florida, only 15 miles from downtown Jacksonville. Residents enjoy a wide array of activities and amenities, transportation, security, dining and sociability. Plus, they have the peace of mind knowing that excellent medical care is available to all residents and that all levels of their future care

will be provided, if and when needed.

Originally, Moosehaven required residents to serve as their own gardeners, housekeepers, kitchen helpers, seamstresses, and maintenance workers. In the words of James J. Davis,

"Our intention is to organize the residents so that they might help each other and help themselves, and provide from their own energy the major part of the cost of their keep."

Today, one will find residents involved in activities that include bowling, water aerobics and swimming, arts and crafts, computer classes, fishing, games, movies, community volunteers, gardening, dancing, and parties. Residents also participate in the many community events held on the Moosehaven campus. These events include the annual Easter Egg Hunt and Halloween Trick or Treat, pancake breakfasts, car shows, chili cook offs, and the Fourth of July. Added to the social schedule are District meetings, Georgia Tree Lighting, and as always in March, Florida Days.



Moosehaven strives to meet the retirement needs of all Moose members. Under the Moosehaven Retirement Program, two plans are available to choose from. Each plan requires that the applicant be a member of The Loyal Order of Moose or Women of the Moose. The applicant must also demonstrate that they can live independently, and without assistance.



The Traditional Retirement Plan will require at least 15 years of Moose membership and that the applicant be in good standing. Residents place all of the financial resources and income into individual Moosehaven Retirement Accounts. All costs associated with housing, meals, housekeeping, activities, transportation, clothing, personal needs and health care are paid from their individual accounts. Residents receive a quarterly statement to show how their resources are spent to pay for the care and services they receive. In the event the Resident cannot meet these costs at Moosehaven, she or he will not be asked to leave Moosehaven.

Brandon Place at Moosehaven offers fully independent living in well-appointed homes and apartments. Structured as a Continuing Care Retirement Community on the Moosehaven campus, Residents will pay a one-time Entrance Fee, and then an on-going Monthly Fee. Residents maintain their own personal financial portfolio and expenses. Financial qualifications are required for admission.
